Thoughts for the Weeks Ahead

In this month's edition of *The Challenge*, I'm making a pitch for Sunday School. It's been a foundational ministry of most Baptist churches for generations! And I believe it is one of the most important ministries of the church.

The Sunday School movement actually began in Britain in the 1780s during the Industrial Revolution. Well into the 19th century, large numbers of adults and children were spending Monday through Saturday working in factories. The first modest legislative restrictions came in 1802 that limited the number of hours a child could work per day to 12! Christian philanthropists wanted to free these children from a life of illiteracy, but Sunday was the only available time for these children to gain some basic education so "Sunday School" was born. By the mid-19th century, Sunday School attendance was a near universal aspect of childhood. Even parents who did not regularly attend church themselves generally insisted that their children go to Sunday School. Working-class families were grateful for their children to have this opportunity to receive an education. And one of the main teaching texts was the Christian Bible.

Since those days, Sunday School has become a primary vehicle for Christian education. Unfortunately, in recent years, Sunday School has gained a reputation as a "high risk" venture. Many folks avoid it assuming they'll be put on the spot to read obscure Bible passages or confronted with complex theological questions that they're not prepared to answer. As a result, many otherwise faithful Christians are missing an opportunity to grow in an understanding of God's Word ... and an opportunity to build strong and supportive relationships with other Christians.

In my 23-plus years in vocational ministry, I've become convinced that Sunday School is the "glue" that holds a church family together. David Francis, former Director of Sunday School and Discipleship at Lifeway Christian Resources said, "Among those who attend only worship, fewer than 20% were still active five years later. Among those who attended both worship and Sunday School, more than 80% were still active five years later." Thus the idea of "glue."

The purpose of Sunday School here at FBC can be distilled down to four basic tasks: 1) To help people find a relationship with Jesus Christ, 2) To help people grow in biblical knowledge and wisdom, 3) To help people build spiritually supportive relationships with other Christians, and 4) To help the local church more effectively pursue the Great Commission task of making disciples.

If you've not yet made Sunday School a part of your Sunday morning church experience, I'm asking you to take a step of faith and give it a try. I can say with confidence that you won't be put on the spot to do something you're not ready for. And I can also say with confidence that if you'll invest yourself in a Sunday School class, your experience of church will begin to expand and you'll begin to experience God investing Himself in your life. You'll find a list of our current classes on our website or in the Sunday morning worship bulletin ... or you can ask me!

In the last message in the *Experiencing God* sermon series my focus text was Acts 2:42-47 ... which gives us a moving description of the church as God intended it to operate. As I close this article, I want us to consider vss 46-47: "*Day by day continuing with one mind in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, they were taking their meals together with gladness and sincerity of heart, praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord was adding to their number day by day those who were being saved."*

My prayer is that those two verses will increasingly describe FBC Calvert City. See you in Sunday School!


